



In 1948 the University College of London was established at Mona in Jamaica with 33 medical students from the Caribbean in attendance. The former sugar plantation at Mona was transformed into an academic institution with its motto of "The Light Rising from the West." In 1967 the University gained full university status and became known as The UWI by then having added 2 more campuses in Trinidad and Barbados. On March 6, 1988 a group of UWI Alumni met at a luncheon in Toronto to fundraise for scholarships to recognize the university's 40th anniversary. This was how the Toronto Chapter of The University of the West Indies Alumni Association (UWIAA) came into being. Thirty five years later the UWIAA continues to exist and raise an annual fund to assist needy students at the now 5 UWI campuses in the Caribbean region.

Tonight I want to pause and recognize the contributions of the members of the ad hoc committee who formed, planned and campaigned for donations over the years to raise scholarships for needy students. Of the 7 founding members 4 are no longer with us in Maud Fuller, Carol Scott, Kent Donaldson and Dr. Robert Ogilvie. May their souls continue to rest in peace and shine their celestial light on us. The 3 surviving members of the ad hoc committee are Jean Patterson, Lynette Spence and Winston Tinglin. Despite the passage of time these 3 individuals continue to participate and donate in whatever manner necessary to the survival of the UWIAA. As well I want to congratulate the other members of the alumni who despite personal challenges over the years continue to donate to the cause whenever asked.

We also mourn the loss of my co- president Michael Henville in 2018. I recall how Michael and I were invited to meet Elizabeth Buchanan Hind the Chair for this event who came from Jamaica in 2010 on a cold winter February day to plan the inaugural UWI Toronto Benefit Award. In the past and in its 14th year this event has become the talk on the social calendar in Toronto for its fame, ritz and its record of attracting the best of luminaries so appropriate for The UWI motto.

HONOURING OUTSTANDING LEADERS OF CARIBBEAN AND CANADIAN HERITAGE

Luminary Award

Presented to people of Caribbean heritage who have made significant outstanding contributions on an international scale in their respective fields, or people who have brought to prominence issues which affect the Caribbean (West Indian) region.

G. Raymond Chang Award

Presented to individuals who exemplify the leadership and ideals for which Dr. the Honourable G. Raymond Chang, OC, OJ stood. Dr. Chang was recognized as an outstanding business leader and philanthropist who embodied great humility and commitment to the betterment of communities in Canada and beyond.

Chancellor's Award

Presented to Caribbean organizations / institutions that have achieved outstanding success, or Canadian organizations/institutions that have contributed significantly to the Caribbean (West Indies) or brought to prominence issues which affect the region.

Vice-Chancellor's Award

Presented to individuals of Caribbean-Canadian heritage who have attained success in their field of endeavours.

Process of Nomination and Awards

- 1. Nominations are made to the Office of the Vice-Chancellor and The University of the West Indies Toronto Benefit Awards Committee. A database of all nominated individuals along with their bios are maintained in the Vice-Chancellor's Office.
- 2. Each year The UWI Toronto Benefit Awards shortlists nominees in each category.
- 3. The names are forwarded to the Vice-Chancellor's Office and the Patron of the event.
- 4. Awardees are selected for each category.
- 5. Awardees are notified.
- 6. Awardees are announced.
- 7. Presentations of awards are made at The UWI Toronto Benefit Awards.

Sheryl is the founding director of the DIVA (Divinely Inspired Victoriously Anointed) Foundation 501(C)3 which she created in memory of the many friends she had lost to HIV/AIDS. She also created the critically acclaimed Divas Simply Singing! an evening of song and entertainment that is the longest consecutive running musical AIDS benefit in the country. Dr. Dodridge Miller, FCCA, MBA, LLM, LLD (Hon)

Group President and Chief Executive Officer, Sagicor Financial Company Ltd.



Dodridge Denton Miller was born at Cliff, which, is located in the magnificent mountain range in the republic of St. John, the garden parish of Barbados. He describes himself as the middle child of almost a cricket team of 9 siblings, being the younger of a twin batting at numbers 4 and 5.

For most of his school days he lived at Knight's Village in St. John, where he came under the formidable and formative influence of his grandmother, who was literally the godmother of the village – a hard-working but warm, generous, and nurturing matriarch. His secondary school was Hilda Skeene's Industry High School in St. Philip, and he earned his A levels at the Barbados Community College. From there he joined Pannell Kerr Foster and wasted no time in passing the ACCA.

Mr. Miller is considered one of the leading financial minds in the Caribbean and beyond.

He has master-minded the rise of Sagicor Financial from the Barbados Mutual Life Assurance Society, to become the Caribbean's largest global financial conglomerate; taking a 162-year-old Barbadian company with less than \$100 million dollars of assets, to a publicly listed, multinational, corporation with over \$10 billion US dollars in assets. Sagicor is the first and largest Caribbean company on the London Stock Exchange.

His meteoric rise within the company was a consequence of dynamic and visionary leadership as he became President and CEO in 2002.

Sagicor moved into the United States insurance market in 2005. Significant achievements since then have demonstrated a burning desire to do everything possible for the advancement and development of the Caribbean, and to make Barbados a global player.

Mr. Miller's global reach is balanced by his love for learning, and for The University of the West Indies as Sagicor has given UWI some 4 million US dollars over-the last several years to assist in the transformation of the Cave Hill campus.

Chancellor's Award

BlackNorth Initiative (BNI)

A social justice initiative designed to remove anti-Black systemic barriers negatively affecting the lives of Black Canadians.







The BlackNorth Initiative is a Canadian non-profit organization founded in June 2020 by Dr. Wes Hall, a prominent business leader and philanthropist. The organization was created in response to the ongoing systemic anti-Black racism faced by Black Canadians.

The mandate of the BlackNorth Initiative is to promote advancement and remove the systemic barriers negatively affecting Black Canadians. This includes increasing the representation of Black Canadians in leadership positions, improving economic opportunities for Black Canadians, and addressing the inequalities Black Canadians face in areas such as education and healthcare.

The BlackNorth Initiative has implemented several programs and initiatives to achieve its goals. These include the BlackNorth Initiative CEO Pledge, which calls on Canadian business leaders to commit to specific actions to address systemic racism in their organizations. The pledge includes commitments such as increasing diversity in hiring and promotions, supporting anti-racism education and training and setting targets to measure progress. To date, the BlackNorth Initiative has over 500 organizations that have signed the CEO Pledge.

The BlackNorth Initiative has also established five action committees to address Economic Empowerment, Health, Youth, Education and Mentorship. These committees are composed of business leaders and experts who are working to develop solutions to the specific challenges faced by Black Canadians in these areas.

In addition, the organization has launched the Homeownership Bridge Program, which enables working, lower-income Black families in the GTA with household incomes as low as \$65,000 to become homeowners and help build home equity and the opportunity to transfer ownership to the next generation. The BlackNorth Academy is a bespoke C-Suite and board preparedness program. The BlackNorth Connect Program is a platform designed to provide access to internships and job postings for early career recruitment and mentorships and bursaries for post-secondary education. The Work Live Opportunity provides studio/housing space for Black Artists. The BlackNorth Initiative scholarships & bursaries are provided to students in a variety of educational fields or at different academic levels.

The BlackNorth Initiative has made significant progress in promoting the advancement of Black Canadians and addressing systemic racism in Canada. While there is still much work to be done, the organization's commitment to creating lasting change is a positive step forward in the fight against anti-Black racism and inequality.

Verene A. Shepherd, graduate of the University of the West Indies (UWI) and the University of Cambridge, is Professor Emerita of Social History at The UWI, a past University Director of The Institute for Gender & Development Studies, current Director of the Centre for Reparation Research, also at the UWI and Chair of the oldest UN Treaty Body, The Committee on the Elimination of Racial Discrimination (CERD), the first Black woman from the African Diaspora to hold that post. Professor Shepherd is also the current CERD focal point to the Working Group of Experts on People of African Descent, of which she is a former Chair. As a UN expert she has played a role in helping to implement the UN International Year for People of African descent and overseeing the drafting of the programme of activities for the UN International Decade for people of African descent while she was Chair of the Working Group of Experts on People of African Descent

Professor Shepherd is also Hon. Fellow, Jesus College, Cambridge, a Vice-Chair of The CARICOM Reparation Commission and a member of the Jamaica National Council on Reparation. Her research interests are in the areas of Jamaican Social History, Gender Studies and Human Rights, including reparation. In addition to her peer-reviewed articles and her co-authored and co-edited publications, she is the sole author of 7 books, among them, The Biography of Lucille Mathurin Mair published by The UWI Press in 2020; I Want to Disturb my Neighbour: Lectures on Slavery, Emancipation and Post-Colonial Jamaica (Ian Randle Pubs, 2007) and Maharani's Misery: Narratives of a Passage from India to the Caribbean (UWI Press, 2002).

A much sought-after public speaker, she has lectured at Universities and other venues in Africa, Asia, Canada, Latin America and the Caribbean, the UK, USA and Europe. She has received several awards, including The UWI Vice-Chancellor's Award for Excellence for Public Service (2017) and the Order of Distinction, Commander Class from the Govt. of Jamaica for her work in History and Gender Studies and her public service.

Patrick "Panman Pat" McNeilly Steelpan Ensemble "Panman Pat" McNeilly is one of Canada's pioneers in steelpan and calypso and remains a popular calypso composer and performer. Arriving in Canada in 1966, he took part in the very first Caribana (Toronto Caribbean Carnival) in 1967. Pat developed the first Steelpan curriculum as a credit course in Grades 9, 10 and 11 at the Etobicoke Board - contributing greatly to steelpan's wide popularity in Toronto's school system. Pat has won numerous awards for his lifelong work in calypso and steelpan in Canada. Panman Pat Strolling Band is one of his many creative projects – called "pan-around-the-neck" - and features vintage steelpan instruments of the 1950s.



KÔSA (Stacy Darko) is an eccentric vocalist, songwriter, and producer. A storyteller who paints vivid imagery through her lyrics, and conjures sounds of an altruistic infusion of avant-garde-pop with operatic and classical elements, alternative- electronic synths and afro- centric rhythms. KÔSA's spark for classical music started at a young age. During her adolescence, her passion for music blossomed at the Regent Park School Of Music, a non-profit organization, (which landed her a a feature in the documentary, "My Piece of the City - The Journey"; performing her original song, EMBER) and later majored in Opera at The University of British Columbia, where she had the opportunity to perform in The Cunning Little Vixen in the Czech Republic. Upon her return home, (Toronto, ON), she found strength and comfort in exploring her own style in music. In the past few years KÔSA has gone on to write and produce her 4 EPS, including her latest, Tempest Love (2019).

Most recently Sean produced a magical Christmas concert benefiting 'The Daily Bread Food Bank', featuring Divine Brown, Jackie Richardson and The Toronto Concert Orchestra. With sold out shows, roles in movies and commercials and songs playing at 30,000 feet, Sean Jones continues to pursue the career he loves while sharing his music with the world.



His master pieces have been sought worldwide and can be found in the private collections of international celebrities such as Stevie Wonder, Arnold Schwarzenegger, Diahann Carroll, and Alice Walker. His ceramic works have also served as official Jamaican gifts to Heads of States and other public figures including President Nelson Mandela of South Africa, President Bill Clinton of the U.S.A., Leonid Brezhnev of the Soviet Union, Prime Minister Phan Van Dong of Vietnam, President Lopez Portillo of Mexico, Roberta Flack and Maya Angelou.

For his contribution to the Arts, the Jamaican government awarded him the Order of Distinction, a national honour, and the Council of the Institute of Jamaica awarded him the Silver Musgrave Medal for outstanding merit in the field."
